You should enroll in EFMP if you have a:







- dependent adult of any age
- Who requires special medical
- Who receives ongoing services from a medical specialist
- Who has significant behavioral health concerns

SPECIAL EDUCATION NEEDS

You should enroll if you have a:



from birth to age 21

- services through an Individualized Who receives special education
- Who receives special medical services

Education Program

- through an Individualized Family Who receives early intervention
- Or is eligible for these services

Enrollment in the EFMP is mandatory for active duty military members. When a family member is identified with special medical and/or educational needs, the special needs are documented through enrollment in the EFMP. Medical services work with families to coordinate identification and enrollment in EFMP.

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Enrollment ensures that the family member's documented medical and/or educational needs are considered during the assignment process. EFMP enrollment is required before you may enroll in TRICARE ECHO.

EFMP Family Support plays a critical role in helping families navigate the Identification and Enrollment and Assignment Coordination processes. They also connect families with resources and support – helping them to become their own best advocate – with services including:

- Information and referral for military support providers and community services
- Education, Social programs, Outreach
- Warm handoffs to the EFMP at the next
- Non-clinical case management
- Family Assessment & Service Planning



Exceptional Family Member Program for All Ages

Background

The Office of Community Support for Military Families with Special Needs is focused on improving support for military families requiring medical or educational consideration through the development of policies and oversight of the Exceptional Family Member Program. Program policies and activities are designed to assist families with children and adults requiring individualized care for special medical or educational needs.

Highlights

A family member with special needs is a:

- Spouse, child or incapacitated adult, who, regardless of age, has special medical needs and requires medical care for a chronic condition, receives ongoing services from a medical specialist or has significant behavioral health concerns
- Child (birth through age 21) with special education needs who is eligible for, or receives, either early intervention services through an individualized family service plan, or special education services through an Individualized Education Program

Enrollment in the program is mandatory for family members who have identified special medical or education needs. This ensures that the family member's needs are considered during the assignment process.

















Attorneys can help families navigate SPECIAL EDUCATION legal issues for students whose educational performance is adversely impacted by their disabilities
