**WHO ARE CHILD AND YOUTH
BEHAVIORAL MILITARY AND FAMILY LIFE
COUNSELORS AND WHAT DO THEY DO?**

Child and youth behavioral military and family life counselors are:

- » Master's or doctorate-level licensed counselors specializing in child and youth behavioral issues
- » Available at no cost to assist children and youth, parents, family members and staff of child and youth programs
- » Available to provide short-term, non-medical counseling support

Services are private and confidential with the exception of child abuse or neglect, domestic abuse or any other duty-to-warn situations.

- » School adjustment
- » Deployment and separation
- » Reunion adjustment
- » Sibling and parent-child communication
- » Behavioral concerns

**HOW DO CHILD AND YOUTH
BEHAVIORAL MILITARY AND FAMILY LIFE
COUNSELORS MAKE A DIFFERENCE?**

Child and youth behavioral military and family life counselors provide a wide range of support to military children and youth, family members and staff who work with children by:

- » Engaging in activities with children and youth
- » Providing behavioral interventions in classrooms, at camps and in Child Development Centers to assist staff in setting and managing boundaries
- » Modeling behavioral techniques and providing feedback to staff
- » Being available to parents and staff to discuss interactions with children and other concerns
- » Facilitating psycho-educational groups
